



Typical pitch set up. Extra parking is available in the late-arrival and overflow car park located near the site entrance.

PITCHING INSTRUCTIONS

Your designated pitch is approximately 10 metres by 10 metres, while the actual pitching zone is 7.5 metres by 7.5 metres. In most instances, we recommend that you pitch in the top left part of your pitching zone. You are welcome to use your discretion, depending on the orientation of the sun (and any shadows cast) plus placement of any awnings. Before pitching, please ensure that you have the correct pitch and that you are spaced at least 2.5 metres away from the next pitch to avoid being asked to move. Pitches must be vacated by 11.00am on the day of your departure.

CHILDREN

Parents are responsible for their children at all times. Adults are asked to always accompany their children to the toilets and shower block.

DOGS

We welcome up to two dogs per pitch. These must be kept on short leads at all times. Never leave dogs unattended on the site. Owners are responsible for cleaning up after their pets – please double-bag any 'accidents' and place in the general waste bins near the site entrance.

VEHICLES

All vehicles are to be registered upon booking. Please drive slowly into the camping fields as this is a family site with children playing. A maximum speed limit of 5mph must be kept at all times. If you arrive or come back to the site after 9.00pm, we ask that you park in our designated late arrivals area near the entrance of the site, and return to collect your car and bring it to your pitch after 8.00am.

FIRES

Strictly no campfires on the ground. Barbeques and fire pits must be raised high enough so as not to burn the grass, and must be extinguished thoroughly after use.

SMOKING

Please do not smoke within 20 metres of buildings on the site. Please extinguish cigarettes thoroughly and place in your general waste.

GAS

Do not put barbeques or gas appliances in your tent, awning, or caravan. Please ensure that no exhausts are covered by awnings.

NOISE-EMITTING EQUIPMENT

The site must be quiet from 10.00pm and 8.00am. While radios are permitted, we ask that all visitors are considerate to their neighbours and keep all music and other noise-emitting devices at a low volume, as this is a quiet, peaceful site.

RECYCLING

Please recycle your glass, paper, tins, cardboard and plastic in the designated recycling bins near the site entrance. Do not leave rubbish outside your tent or caravan as it creates mess and attracts animals. Please put any food in sealed containers to avoid scavengers.

WASTE DISPOSAL

Please do not put face wipes or cleansing wipes in the chemical waste as they do not degrade. We ask that face wipes, cleaning wipes, nappies, sanitary materials, and dog poo are all double-bagged and placed in the general waste bins near the site entrance.

KITES AND DRONES

As gusts of wind can cause kites and drones to crash into tents and campervans, we ask that no kites or drones are flown on the site.

BIKES AND SCOOTERS

Bicycles are permitted to be ridden appropriately until dusk only. To keep all of our guests safe, children's motorised scooters and quad bikes are not permitted on site.

SAFETY AND SECURITY

The owners of Home Farm live on-site and are available 24/7 if you require any emergency assistance, advice, or directions.
